Introduction

The Government of Karnataka has desired to make the study and research of law through systematic instruction, teaching and training in law and to inculcate among citizens a sense of meaningful concern for the law in a system of parliamentary democracy in the State of Karnataka. To achieve this end the Government of Karnataka has wished to institutionalize schooling of laws, thro' the Karnataka State Law University. Thus, it has promulgated the Karnataka State Law University Act, 2009, (Karnataka Act No.11 of 2009) on January 01, 2009

Location

The seat of the University is in the midst of hillocks, on a sprawling 53.23 acres of land, Hubli-Dharwad Corporation main road (N H -4), close to Office of Commissioner, Regional Road Transport. Navanagar, Hubli.

Jurisdiction

Transfer of student from one Law College to another Law College

Rules & regulations for transfer admission of students between affiliated colleges of Karnataka State Law University, Hubli –U.G.Degree. A Student who wants to take transfer from one college to another college within the University following conditions have to be fulfilled:

- 1) He/she must have taken admission in any of the colleges affiliated to Karnataka State Law University and his admission is approved by the Karnataka State Law University.
- 2) Such transfer can be made only in the special cases like transfer of parents, health problem or the like.
- 3) The transfer may be taken either in the odd semester or in the even semester but, before 30 days the date of Examination notification of respective semester.
- 4) The college in which the student intends to take admission should take the No Objection Certificate to the effect that there are sufficient seats in the college and the subjects are also same.
- 5) No Objection Certificate has to be obtained from the Principal of the transferring college giving particulars about his attendance and MPC etc.,
- 6) If the candidate is qualified, and by verifying his marks card and other documents the Principal may give admission pending approval from the Karnataka State Law University, Hubli.
- 7) Such admission on transfer has to be approved by the KSLU, Hubli and the Principal of the college who has taken admission has to forward an application of the student, accompanying with a fee of Rs.3000/- (in favour of Finance Officer, KSLU, Hubli) with the following documents.
 - i) NOC from both the colleges.
 - ii) DD or Bank Challan of Rs. 3000/-
 - iii) NOC implying that Intake does not exceed and subjects also are same.
 - iv) No MPC of the student.
- 8) It is responsibility of the transferee college to get the transfer Certificate (T.C) within one month from the college from which the student has been transferred.
- 9) The transfer from other Universities can be made on approval of Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor only when the combination of the subjects are same and with the production of the Migration Certificate of the previous University.
- 10) The transfer is valid only if the University approves his transfer.

Co – Scholastic Activities

The University is aiming to make every Law College as a hub of Curricular Co – Curricular and extra – curricular activities to inculcate leadership quality with socio – legal conscience among the students. Programs on National Service Scheme (NSS), legal aid, legal literacy, Sports, Fine arts are carefully have been designed to make their stay in the College meaningful and result oriented.

Examination and rule for promotion

B.A., LL.B. (5Years Course)

PROHIBITION AGAINST LATERAL ENTRY AND EXIT

There shall be no lateral entry on the plea of graduation in any subject or exit by way of awarding a degree splitting the integrated double degree course, at any intermediary stage of integrated double degree course.

PROMOTION

- (a) No student shall be promoted to the next year of the course unless he/she has passed in a minimum of two subjects either from one or two semester of that academic year.
- (b) Students are required to successfully complete the entire course within ten years from admission to the course.

B.B.A., LL.B. (5Years Course)

PROHIBITION AGAINST LATERAL ENTRY AND EXIT

There shall be no lateral entry on the plea of graduation in any subject or exit by way of awarding a degree splitting the integrated double degree course, at any intermediary stage of integrated double degree course.

PROMOTION

- (a) No student shall be promoted to the next year of the course unless he/she has passed in a minimum of one subject in each semester.
- (b) Students are required to successfully complete the entire course within ten years from admission to the course.

B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) (5Years Course)

- A student who has completed all the courses prescribed for the two semesters in an academic year by securing not less than forty percent of the marks in each of the courses shall be eligible to pursue his studies in the next academic year of the program.
- Provided that the University may
 - a) Permit a student to pursue the program in the second academic year even if he has not successfully completed three out of all the courses prescribed for study in the first academic year;
 - b) Permit a student to pursue the program in the third year although he has not successfully completed three out of all the courses prescribed for study for the second year provided he has successfully completed all the courses prescribed for the first year of the program;

- c) Permit a student to pursue the program in the fourth year although he has not successfully completed three out of all the courses prescribed for study for the third year provided he has successfully completed all the courses prescribed for the second year of the program;
- d) Permit a student to pursue the program on the fifth year although he has not successfully completed three out of all the courses prescribed for study for the fourth year provided he has successfully completed all the courses prescribed for the third year of the program.
- e) A student who does not secure a minimum of 40% in any course shall be declared as failed.
- f) Students who have failed in a course may be permitted to repeat the following end of semester examination provided he or she makes an application to the Principal of the college within the date prescribed by the University by paying required fees.
- The University shall permit a student to improve his score in any semester when he has secured minimum of 40% marks in each of the course.
- Notwithstanding the foregoing, the University may permit a student who has carried forward not more than three courses from any or all of the previous semesters to continue in the program provided he successfully completes those courses by the time the final results of the Five Year B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) program are announced.
- Student who has filled the exam form by paying prescribed fee but remained absent in the exam shall only be permitted to appear in those subjects along with subsequent semester examination.

LL.B. (3Years Course)

PROMOTION

- (a) Every student shall be promoted to the next higher class irrespective of the fact that he has failed in any of the papers prescribed for the study.
- (b) Students are required to successfully complete the entire course within six years from admission to the course.

LL.M. Course

Promotion

- a) A students who has completed all the courses prescribed for the two semesters in an academic year by securing not less than forty percent of the marks in each of the subjects shall be eligible to pursue his studies in the next academic year o the programme.
- b) Provided that the University may,
 - Permit a student to pursue the programme in the second academic year even if he has not successfully completed three out of all the courses prescribed for study in the first academic year.
 - A student who does not secure a minimum of 40% in any course shall be declared as failed.
 - Students who have failed in a course may be permitted to repeat the following end of semester examination provided he or she makes an application to the Principal of the college or Chairman of the Department of Studies within 10 days from the date of announcement of the results and pays the prescribed fee each course.
- c) The University shall permit a student to improve his score in any semester when he has secured a minimum of 40% marks in each of the course.
