The legal system is bound to resolve these challenges in view of the compelling sentiment of capability justice and paradigmatic principles of equality.

The inbuilt intricacies associated with law relating to vulnerable sections of the society require the teachers to search for additional viewpoints to guide the students to understand the myriad issues with different levels of intensity. Creative energy of the teachers in articulating and explaining influential factors responsible for enforcement of such laws to the students could remarkably bring those laws into impressive play by flooding metes and bounds of objectives of these laws. Accordingly, realizing the preponderating value of the teaching and appropriate pedagogy required for the genuine brain mapping of social brain of legal regime on marginalized sections of the society, the present FDP has been organized by the University.
