## About KSLU

KSLU was established by the Government of Karnataka by enacting the Karnataka State Law University Act, 2009, with the intent of bridging the gap between theory and practice of law. The Karnataka State Law University aims at educating the populace in the true spirit of actuality, creating socio-legal consciousness, unveiling employment openings by imparting a better outlook and approach at a reasonable and affordable cost. The UGC conferred 12 B status and the NAAC team has accredited the University with 'A' grade .

The University is the single largest Law University in India having the credit of 92 Affiliated Law Colleges under its umbrella. It is located in the amidst hillocks, on a sprawling 52 acres of land near Hubli-Dharwad Corporation, close to the Office of the Commissioner, Regional Road Transport at Navanagar, Hubballi.



## About KSLU's Law School

The defining distinction of the University is its compelling vision of commitment to high quality legal education. It is reflected in its effort to create an intellectual ambience to ensure that the study of law is firmly believes in bridging the gap between theory and practice. KSLU established KSLU's Law School as the working model for all its affiliated law colleges. The Law School is emerging as one of the premier legal educational institutions of the Country, which blends Indian native school teaching, learning principles with modern technologies, in educative process.



## PROGRAMMES OFFERED

### Undergraduate Programmes

In pursuit of its goal of promoting integrated knowledge, KSLU's law school, offers integrated honours courses in two disciplines, i.e., in liberal arts (B.A.) and managerial excellence (B.B.A.). The undergraduate degree in law integrates into stipulated five years. The programme gives the students ample opportunities and choice; whether it be litigation, academia, entrepreneurship, international private or public law practice, corporate practice, civil services, alternative dispute resolution including arbitration and mediation, and work with international non-profit organizations.

The five year-integrated B.A.,LL.B.(Hons.) programme combines training in law with knowledge of the social sciences. For a law student knowledge of the liberal arts is a prerequisite, as this profession works in a socio-political context. The liberal arts component of the B.A., LL.B.(Hons.) programme includes five arts subjects (Political Science, Sociology, History, Economics and Psychology), which is supplemented by a range of law courses; and together they provide a broad based multi-disciplinary foundation to the curricula.

The Law School also provides a five-year B.B.A., LL.B.(Hons.), conjoint study programme which combines law with undergraduate level business administration. In this course law subjects are studied in conjunction with business administration subjects such as Business Environment, Financial Accounting, Principles and Practice of Management, Quantitative Techniques Entrepreneurship Development, International Business, Human Resource Management, Financial Management, Financial Services, Marketing management, Production and operations management and Business Communication. This course is designed, keeping in mind the emergent needs of a fast growing economy of India.

The steady and growing influx of multinationals has created an overwhelming demand for legal managers and the said course is tailor-made to meet the requirements of a student. These undergraduate courses along with liberal social science or management subjects along with two language subjects, i.e., English and Kannada are taught to enable the students to understand the concepts of law better.

### Eligibility Criteria for Admission

An applicant who has successfully completed Pre-University Course or Senior Secondary School course ('+2') or equivalent such as (11+1, 'A' level in Senior School Leaving Certificate Course) from a recognized University of India or outside or from Senior Secondary Board or equivalent, constituted or recognized by the Union or by the State Government or from any equivalent institution from a foreign country recognized by the government of that country for the purpose of issue of qualifying certificate on successful completion of the course, may apply for and be admitted into the course.

Candidate who have appeared for the Pre-University Examination and are awaiting results may also appear for the Admission Test. But, such candidates will be admitted to the Five Year B.A., LL.B./ B.B.A., LL.B (Hons.) Programmes only after fulfilling the conditions stipulated in these Regulations, and other conditions which the University may prescribe from time to time.

Minimum percentage of marks in qualifying examination shall not be below 45% (44.5% and above shall be treated as 45%) of total marks in case of general category applicants and 40% (39.5% and above shall be treated as 40%) of total marks in case of SC and ST applicants.

Maximum age for seeking admission is limited to twenty years in case of general category of applicants and to twenty two years in the case of applicants from SC, ST and other backward communities.

### **Admission procedure**

- i. Candidates seeking admission to five year B.A., / B.B.A., LL.B.(Hons.) course shall have to appear for an Admission test designed to decide the candidate's skill in comprehension, communication, knowledge of arithmetic and his aptitude for legal learning.
- ii. The Admission test shall be administered by the University or any other body duly authorized by the University to do so.
- iii. The duration of the test, will ordinarily be two hours.
- iv. The University or the body authorized to administer the test may prescribe question papers, have the answer scripts assessed and prepare a list of candidates based upon merit.  
Provided that, in respect of rural candidates who have passed qualifying examination, a weightage of five percent shall be given which will be added to the marks obtained by the candidate at the Admission test before finalizing the merit test.
- v. Candidates desirous of appearing for Admission test shall obtain application form from their respective colleges or from the body authorized by the University to make such applications available on payment of prescribed fees.  
Provided that, while making admission to the course, reservation policy of the Government of Karnataka governing admission to higher education institutions issued from time to time shall be applied.

### **Attendance**

No student shall be permitted to appear for the end-of-semester examination in a given course unless he/she has, to the satisfaction of the course teacher, fulfilled the course requirements and has put in not less than 75% attendance in the course concerned.

Provided that a student who has attended not less than 70% of classes in each of the subjects prescribed may be permitted to keep the term for reasons to be recorded in writing and to the satisfaction of the Principal of the College or the Dean of the Faculty as the case may be.

### **Medium of Instruction**

The medium of instruction in the Five Year B.A., LL.B.(Hons.) Degree Course shall be English. However, the examinees shall have the option to answer the question papers in the examination either in English or in Kannada.

### **Promotion**

A student who has completed all the courses prescribed for the two semesters in an academic year by securing not less than forty percent of the marks in each of the courses shall be eligible to pursue his studies in the next academic year of the programme.

Provided that the University may -

- i. permit a student to pursue the programme in the next academic year even if he has not successfully completed three out of all the courses prescribed for study in the previous academic year;
- ii. A student who does not secure a minimum of 40% in any course shall be declared as failed.
- iii. Students who have failed in a course may be permitted to repeat the following end of semester examination provided he or she makes an application to the Principal of the college within the date prescribed by the University by paying required fees.

The University shall permit a student to improve his score in any semester when he has secured a minimum of 40% marks in each of the course.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the University may permit a student who has carried forward not more than three courses from any or all of the previous semesters to continue in the programme provided he successfully completes those courses by the time the final results of the Five Year B.A.,LL.B.(Hons.)/ B.B.A., LL.B.(Hons.) programmes are announced.

Student who has filled the exam form by paying prescribed fee but remained absent in the exam shall only be permitted to appear in those subjects along with subsequent semester examination.

## **Post Graduate Programmes**

The Law School offers Master's Degree programme in three specialized areas, i.e., Constitutional and Administrative Law, Intellectual Property Rights Laws and Criminal Law. The programme is of two year duration, which is particularly designed for law graduates who plan to acquire advanced and specialized training in the field of Law and other disciplines, preparing them for careers in academia (both law schools and other departments), Government and policymaking.

### **Eligibility Criteria for Admission**

(1) An applicant who has graduated in law from a University established by an Act of Parliament or by a State Legislature or an equivalent national institution recognized as a Deemed to be University or a foreign University recognized as equivalent to the status of an Indian University by the Equivalence Committee of Karnataka State Law University competent to declare equivalence, may apply for LL.M. degree course.

(2) Minimum percentage of marks in qualifying examination shall not be below 45% of total marks in case of general category applicants and 40% of total marks in case of SC and ST applicants.

### **Admission Procedure**

Admission to LL.M. Programme shall be strictly on the basis of merit taking into account total marks obtained in qualifying examination.

Provided that, while making admission to the course reservation policy of the Government of Karnataka governing admission to higher education institutions issued from time to time shall be applied.

### **Attendance:**

(1) No student shall be permitted to appear for the end-of-semester examination in a given course unless he/she has, to the satisfaction of the course teacher, fulfilled the course requirements and has put in not less than 75% attendance in the course concerned.

Provided that a student who has attended not less than 65% of classes in each of the subjects prescribed may be permitted to keep the term for reasons to be recorded in writing and to the satisfaction of the Chairman of the P.G. Department/ Director of Law School as the case may be.

## FEATURES OF LAW SCHOOL

### CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

#### Upgraded Syllabus

Legal education is a professional endeavor requiring certain practical skills. Students graduating from law institutions have an articulated understanding of law on paper; they seldom have any idea of its workings in the social matrix. To meet out the professional requirements of the courses, the Law School addresses these concerns of the legal fraternity by offering innovatively designed curricula that meets professional requirements. Further, the Honours course is designed to give extensive knowledge on law subjects; hence specialized subjects are made part of the curriculum. The University constitutes a committee of experts in the legal field to upgrade the existing syllabi from time to time.

The methodology adopted in the Law School is essentially learner centred and research oriented, strengthening students in reflective and critical thinking skills along with value-orientation. Modern teaching methods are used in a convergent manner, along with the lecture method. These include the Class Room Presentations, Group Discussions, Seminars, Case Studies, Project Based Method, Computer Assisted Learning and Experiential Learning.

#### Simulation exercises

As per the mandate of the Bar Council of India, the syllabi of these Courses include clinical Legal Education, such as Professional Ethics, Alternative Dispute Resolution systems, Drafting pleading and Conveyancing; and moot exercises and internship. These courses are taught by integrating classroom teaching with simulation exercises. Efforts are being made to expose students to court realities. The teaching methods adopted for these courses are such as to promote multi-disciplinary inquiry and practical appreciation of problems. The method of teaching involves lectures, discussions, case studies, Mock trial and project work.

#### Special lectures

To promote the dialectic on cross-disciplinary cutting-edge issues and create finest learning experience possible, KSLU has established the tradition of participatory memorial and special lectures. Through these memorial and special lectures, the students get the opportunity of listening and interacting with the stalwarts of law. These lectures are delivered by eminent scholars, lawyers and judges of Supreme Court and High Courts. These are of great help to the students that delve deeper into law and also broaden their social horizons.

#### Conferences and Workshops

Conferences and workshops are the boons to academics, researchers, professionals, students and many others. A conference provides a platform to discuss the strengths, weakness, opportunities and threats involved in a particular area of law. It will be a forum for new ideas and concepts and also would endeavour to examine the different dimensions of the concept; it will throw light on the enactments, amendments made in the legal field and latest developments therein. With the goal of giving the best to the students of the Law School every year, KSLU organises conferences in different areas of law. Resource persons, researched presentations and the intellectual interactions made will enable the students to gain in-depth knowledge about the area. Besides, it acts as supplement to the regular classroom teaching.

#### Spoken English Classes

The College has employed fulltime faculty for guiding and coaching the students, who are weak in communication. To improve their communication skills, grammar classes, spoken English classes and other remedial measures are being organized and conducted at different levels throughout the academic year. To equip the students with literature, an English club organizes discussions on literature for students. In addition to that, add on course in English is available to improve the language skills of the students.

## CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

### **Moot Court Activities**

Real time skills neither be taught in the classroom, nor in internship. A moot is a simulated court exercise where students get practical training and knowledge of litigation skills. Under the expert guidance of committed faculty members, students of the Law School are trained to represent the School at moot competitions across the country. The Law School regularly invites renowned “mooters” from all over India and abroad to acquaint students with the nitty-gritty of mooting; create a platform to share mooting experience and their insights.

To provide sufficient exposure to all students and to provide opportunities to hone their professional abilities, the institution has started two moot court competitions, one at state level and another at national level. The students of the School are encouraged to participate in various moot court competitions.

### **Legal Aid Camps and Awareness Programmes**

As part of the curriculum, students of Law School are involved in legal aid camps, legal awareness programmes etc., which aim at giving practical knowledge about legal issues in society. To inculcate social commitment in students and also to expose them to the problems of the urban and rural poor, a series of legal literacy programmes are arranged in and around Hubballi-Dharwad through Students Legal Aid Clinic and NSS Unit. The students not only impart legal literacy on topics relevant to the lives of the target group, they also convey the message through appropriate skits. These programmes will help the students if they choose a career in litigation in the future.

### **Internship at prestigious institutions**

Internships are the instruments to introduce the students of law to potential future work environments that facilitate a student to decide on the path to be taken in future. It will enable the student to cultivate important supplementary skills during an internship and establish contacts with potential future employers. An internship provides a variety of benefits for the students who want to widen their job opportunities.

## EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

### **Sports**

Sports and Games are essential components of human resource development, that help to promote good health, comradeship and spirit of healthy competition, which in turn has positive impact on development of personality of the Youth, who is the potential source of energy, enthusiasm and inspiration for development, progress and prosperity of a nation. With this in view, the Law School has always encouraged its students to participate in sport activities and physical training. To do full justice to this endeavor, KSLU has appointed a Director of Physical Education, who is shouldered with the responsibility of training the students of the School. Sports kits as well as allowances are provided to the sports-persons in order to encourage them to participate in sport activities.

### **Cultural activities**

Artistic and cultural activities are an essential component of healthy and vibrant communities. These activities enable students to experience the rich and vibrant Indian culture in all its facets through festivals, food, attire and art forms so that they internalize a culture that reflects their identity, respects their self-esteem and binds them with their fellow men and women in a diverse pluralistic society not only in India, but also in the global context. The Law School encourages the students to participate in cultural programmes and develop their creative abilities; regardless of whether the aim of the student is education. The Law School has carved its own name in the University and bagged various trophies in the cultural competitions and other platforms, like, Youth Festival, Legal Touchstone, etc.

### **NSS activities**

NSS reflects the essence of democratic living and upholds the need for self-less service. NSS helps the students develop appreciation of the other person's point of view and also show consideration to other living beings. The main objective of this scheme is personality development of the students through community service. Through NSS, the sensitization about social responsibility and national integration among the students community have been achieved to a large extent. This scheme has also proved in reducing the distance between academic institutions and communities. Students enrolled in N.S.S. learn discipline, dignity of labour, teamwork and co-operation.

## SPECIAL ADVISORY CENTERS AND CELLS

### Anti-Ragging Cell

Ragging is a criminal offence as per Karnataka Educational Act 1983 and Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. Ragging in all its forms is totally banned in the Law School including all its premises, (academic, residential, sports, cafeteria, etc.) whether located within the campus or outside and in all means of transportation of students whether public or private. The Law School will take strict actions like; criminal proceedings, cancellation of admission against those found guilty of ragging or abetting ragging and the burden of proof lies on the perpetrator of alleged ragging and not on the victim. An offence of Ragging may be charged either on a written complaint by the affected or on independent finding of the Anti-Ragging Cell.

The Law School is bound by the UGC Regulations on 'Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions 2009'. The Law School has founded an Anti – Ragging Cell which governs the prevention of any means of Ragging either within or outside the School. There have been no incidents of Ragging at the Law School till date.

**Students' Grievance Redressal cell:** A Students Grievance Redressal Cell has been constituted to uphold the dignity of the Law School by ensuring strife free atmosphere through promoting cordial relationship among the Students as well as between teacher and students. The Cell works in collaboration with other two cells of the School, i.e., Prevention of sexual harassment Cell and SC/ST Cell.

The cell will look into the grievances of the students in academic matters, which is related to timely issue of duplicate Mark-sheets, Transfer Certificates, Conduct Certificates or other examination related matters etc., and also other matters like, conditions of sanitation, preparation of food, victimization by teachers etc.

Anyone with a genuine grievance may approach the members of the Cell. In case the person is unwilling to appear in self, grievances may be dropped in writing at the letterbox/ suggestion box of the Law School. Grievances may also be sent through e-mail to the officer in-charge of Students' Grievance Cell.

### Prevention of Sexual Harassment Cell

Keeping with the statutory requirement of the University, the Law School has constituted the Prevention of Sexual Harassment Cell. The primary objectives of the cell are prevention of sexual harassment and promotion of general wellbeing of the female student. It organizes series of workshops, lectures, and discussions to sensitize the young minds regarding gender related issues.

### SC/ST Cell

A Special Cell for the welfare of the Schedule Castes and Scheduled Tribes was established in the year 2012 as per the mandate of the University Grant Commission. The SC/ST Cell functions under the guidance and supervision of SC/ST Students and Grievance Committee. The committee ensures the effective implementation of reservation policy and other welfare measures for SC/ST Students and employees of the Law School.

### Career Guidance Bureau

In connection with placements, a Career Guidance Bureau has been established to undertake the activities related to career counseling and career options, in the field of law for the benefit of all the students of its affiliated law colleges. The Bureau is headed by the Director of Student welfare. The primary focus of the Bureau is to provide information regarding Professional courses, higher studies available in and outside the country; to organize various programmes on Personality Development, Soft Skills, Communication Skills and for the development of professional skills; and to facilitate the students in identifying their interests, strengths and planning appropriately to justify their professional needs.

### Human Rights Cell

This Cell is constituted with the objective of dealing with social evils as well as, to protect the vulnerable class from deprivation of their fundamental rights. The Human Rights Cell works in collaboration with the Government and Non-Government organizations. Its Mission is to take the law to the masses, to every nook and corner of our society, and provide Justice to the downtrodden.

### **Students' Union**

Every year the Law School selects members of the Student Union. The executive body of the Students' Union includes: President, General Secretary, Sports Secretary, Cultural Secretary and two class representatives from each class. The Students' Union is responsible in ensuring the general welfare of the students in academic as well as non-academic fields. The Union's term of office is one academic year.

### **ADDITIONAL FACILITIES**

#### **Digital auditorium**

The KSLU auditorium is a fully digitalized one with excellent centrally air-conditioned hall, technically well-equipped with state of the art acoustics and also equipped with excellent light and sound facilities.

#### **Bank**

A branch of the State Bank of India is situated within the premises of the University, which provides easy banking facilities to both students and staff. The bank has made provision of online payment for the purpose of the admission and other fees.

#### **Canteen**

The open canteen of the Law School is considered as the best place for intellectual interaction among the students of the School. The canteen is spacious and offers hygienic food at affordable rates. It offers a variety of snacks and the south Indian dishes are a specialty at subsidized rates.

#### **Security and Safety**

The law School offers a very safe and secured environment with Close Circuit Cameras installed at all important places and round the clock security. The college also has fire fighting equipment installed at different places.

#### **Water Facility**

Purified water facility is provided to the staff and students of the Law School.

### **OUTSTANDING FEATURES OF THE KSLU's LAW SCHOOL**

#### **Legal Touch Stone**

Legal Touch Stone took shape as a consequence of the fruitful coordination between the parents and teachers of KSLU's Law School. Legal Touch Stone is an event which is sponsored by the parents and teachers of Law School, in which various activities like, seminar, debate, counselling and cultural competitions are held every year.
