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Gender Justice and Feminist Jurisprudence

Objective:

Feminist jurisprudence, as a philosophy of law based on the social, economic and political equality of the sexes, exerts a considerable influence on debates and discourses around the formulation, interpretation and implementation of laws related to gender based violence and discrimination. While the philosophical thought is dedicated to changing women's status through a re-working of the law and its approach to gender justice, injustice to women in many aspects of life is a common phenomenon in India. Against this backdrop, this course aims at critically analysing the law and exploring the potential for and limits of legal transformation in order to achieve gender justice and equality.

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The Chairperson welcomed all the members of the Board of Studies.

The members of the Board deliberated on agenda item elaborately and resolved as under:

Agenda 1. Introduction of Major-Minor Subjects for B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) Programme.

The Board members elaborately discussed the benefits of adopting the Major-Minor system for B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) Programme. It was felt that the system has certain benefits which the students enrolled for B.A., LL.B. Programme in Affiliated Law Colleges are bestowed with. It was considered opinion of the members that, the same benefits should be available to the students of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) Programme also. After due deliberations on the directions of the University Authorities to introduce History as Major subject, Economics and Political Science as Minor subjects was appreciated and approved.

After thorough discussion, the Board considered and approved the syllabus of 6 Papers of History as Major subject and 3 papers for each of Economics and Political Science as Minor subjects of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) Programme.

For B.B.A., LL.B. (Hon's) programme the Board considered and approved to include Business Statistics in place of Quantitative Techniques which is to be studied in Fifth Semester for B.B.A., LL.B. (Hon's) programme.

After this the allocation of subjects to various semester of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) and B.B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) Programmes were meticulously considered. To quench the thirst of students to study the Law subjects in the initial semester itself, and also to integrate Law subjects with foundation subjects, the Board resolved to reallocate the subjects to be studied in Ten semesters of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) and B.B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) Programme.

After intense discussion, the Law subjects and Non Law Subjects to be taught in Ten semesters for B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) and B.B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) Programmes were finalized.

Resolution : It was resolved to introduce History as Major subject, with 6 papers, Economics and Political Science as Minor subjects with 3 papers each with the syllabus as appended in Appendix – I (History 6 papers, Economics 3papers and Political Science 3papers)

For B.B.A.,LL.B.(Hon's) programme it was resolved to include Business Statistics in place of Quantitative Techniques which is to be studied in Fifth Semester of the Programme.

Further it was resolved to adopt the reallocation of subjects to be studied in Ten semesters as appended for B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) Appendix - II and B.B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) Appendix – III.

Agenda 2: Revising of the syllabus

Law being a dynamic subject undergoes periodic changes to meet the requirement of the society. The curriculum and syllabus of the B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) and B.B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) programmes should be updated to incorporate the developments whenever necessary.

To undertake this exercise in a systematic manner in consultation with various stake holders; different subjects were allotted to teachers as shown in Appendix – IV to undertake initial spade work for revising the Syllabus.

As a first step the revised syllabus for the I Semester of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) and B.B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) were approved as appended in Appendix – V and Appendix – VI respectively.

Resolution: It was resolved to adopt the revised syllabus as appended in Appendix – V and VI. As per Appendix IV the respective teachers shall undertake the revision of syllabus for the other semesters from II Semester to X Semesters.

Agenda 3: Any other matter with the permission of chair.

1. Introduction of Add on Course in English.

The members of BOS unanimously felt the urgent need to sufficiently equip the Law students with language skills both spoken and written. As majority of student enrolled in the Law School are from rural area and not adequately equipped with language skills, it is felt

necessary to introduce at least three Add-on Courses in English: First Add-on Course in English in I Semester with emphasis on Grammar, Second Add-on Course in English in II Semester with emphasis on enhancing Speaking Skills and Third Add-on Course in English in IV Semester with emphasis on Writing Skills and Translation Component.

This is further necessary in view of the fact that there is translation component in majority of the qualifying examinations to become a Judge, Prosecutor etc.

Resolution: It was resolved to introduce three Add on Courses in English

For I Semester Add on Course in English Grammar with syllabus as appended in Appendix – VII. It was further resolved that the course teacher shall undertake drafting of the syllabus for other two Add on Courses and submit to the Chairperson BOS.

2.Changes that are to be effected from the Academic year 2022-23.

Resolution: It was resolved to recommend to the University to adopt the below changes with effect from the Academic Year 2022-23 prospectively starting with the batches admitted to I Semester B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) and B.B.A., LL.B. (Hons.).


