# 'Form new laws in consultation with law schools'

**HUBBALLI:** Law & Parliamentary Affairs Minister T B Jayachandra has opined that law degree should have been considered as additional qualification while recruitment for any government appointment.

This would speed up the process of implementing the projects, as the law graduates would know the legal procedures, he added.

He noted this while speak-

ing after inaugurating the new building of the Karnataka State Law University's (KSLU) Law School and the guest house at the KSLU campus at Navanagar near Hubballi on Saturday.

"I have been trying to implement this for the last five years. However, I have failed to do so," he said, and added that if the Congress retains power in the next election, we would consider implementing the

same.

### Consult law students

Mr Jayachandra said, any new law should be formulated in consultation with the law schools and after being deliberated by the students at these schools.

He said, new forms of crime are being committed in the society, and our current laws may not have punishments for the same. Even new technologies are being used to commit crimes, which are not being solved for years. And to track such crimes we need new laws, and such laws should be discussed and deliberated in law schools before being implemented, he noted.

He said, the present judiciary system is under severe stress. Out of the 62 sanctioned

The minister also asked the University officials to submit a proposal to the State government for three hostels-- one each for SC, ST, and Minorities-- at the campus, and he was ready to release Rs 30 crore for the same.

### Inauguration soon

Responding to the demand of Leader of Opposition in Assembly Jagadish Shettar, Mr Jayachandra said, the newly constructed 'world class' court complex at Vidyanagar in Hubballi will be inaugurated in next 10-15 days after clearing all the technical hurdles.

In his presidential address, MLA Arvind Bellad said, since 1991, the Judiciary system is among the least reformed departments in the country. "Today, there is a 100% delayed
