Law students told to adhere to values

Hubballi: Prof D V Nandimath, registrar, National Law School of India University, Bengaluru, inaugurated the 5th International Law Moot Court Competition at Karnataka State Law University (KSLU) here on Friday.

He spoke about the three attributes required to become a good lawyer: namely, possessing domain knowledge, cultivating requisite skills, and subscription to higher ethical values. He said that during a moot court

competition, one gets exposed to all the three requisites. He told students to follow the three methods of learning - to read and learn, see and learn and do and learn. For a lawyer the three C's - client, court and counter party are very important, he added. Prof C S Patil, vice-chancellor, KSLU, advised students to operationalize knowledge and adhere to values. Registrars Ratna Bharamagoudar, G B Patil, students and faculty were present. As many as 20 teams participated in the competition.

Two-day moot court contest at KSLU to kick off today

Hubballi: The ninth edition of the state-level Kannada Moot Court Competition will kick off at the Karnataka State Law University (KSLU), Hubballi on Saturday at the varsity's premises in Navanagar, confirmed vice-chancellor Prof C Basavaraju. The two-day event will be flagged off by retired

KSLU VC Prof Basavaraju, who took charge only recently, said that he was aware of the need to restore the varsity's reputation, which suffered some damage in the past few years

and students into confidence, and channel our energies to setting things right. KSLU is grappling with paucity of staff, and is currently functioning with only 40% of personnel against the total number of sanctioned posts. We will request the state law minister to depute adequate staff, and seek help to improve infrastructure."

On the confusion surrounding the guidelines issued by the University Grants Commission, and the state law department, the VC said that the varsity was bound by rules of both the bodies. "We will write to the authorities concerned to avoid any confusion on this front. Since it is a varsity dedicated to single discipline, there is a need to diversify our academic portfolio, by offering specialised courses," Prof Basavaraju said.

Basavaraju, interacting with representatives of the media on Friday, said that Justice Ravi V. Hosamani, and Justice G. Basavara, sitting judges of the Karnataka high court, would participate in the valedictory on Sunday. Sharing his vision for

the university, the VC, who assumed office only on September 3, said that he was currently engaged in drafting an action plan for the coming academic year.
