Each teacher is given group of fifty students to monitor their progress and give personal and academic guidance on regular basis. Normally interactive sessions are conducted twice in a month. Individual faculty members are assigned as mentors to students to help them to cope with their studies and even problems in their personal domain which impacts their overall performance/wellbeing. Law school also have designated faculty members who interact with, and assist students in both professional and personal matters so that they do not lose focus and are able to improve their academic standards. Faculty disciplinary committee is mandated to have regular student-faculty interaction meetings to take stock of problems/issues and resolve them. The Student Grievance Redressal Cell promptly responds to the learning needs of students with disabilities through the provision of counseling and mentoring support.

Karnataka State Law University Act, 2009, (No.11 of 2009) as a Peoples' University. is having its aspiration to provide quality legal education, totally socially relevant and accessible to everyone. KSLU is a mono faculty university having 107 Law Colleges under its affiliation and having jurisdiction over the entire Karnataka State. The University Library has acquired quality books and a good number of volumes of reports to meet the requirement of the faculty and students. The Library also has facilities of wi fi and online data provision like West Law India, HeinOnline, Manupatra, Inflibnet and N-List for the students. The Library has been automated using an integrated Library Management System. Library holdings can be searched using the Online Public Access Catalogue. The NSS wing of KSLU has done tremendous work in the rural areas by arranging camps like Tree Plantation, Rain Water Harvesting, Blood Donation, Health Check up and Election Awareness in the nearby villages and helped the villagers in their day to day hurdles by giving legal aid service and advice. A special mention should be made about the Directorate of Student Welfare of the University which is making every effort to conduct Seminars, Symposia, Moot Courts, Conferences, Debate, Elocution Competitions and Youth Festivals, extracurricular and extension activities etc. for the students during the academic year. The University is bringing out its

Law Journals regularly since 2013. They contain contributions by Former Chief Justices, Academicians and well known Scholars in the field of Law. The Student Law Review, KSLU's Sports and Entertainment Law Journal Amruthavahini- the KSLU News letter have been brought out. Legal aid programmes are regularly conducted. Besides scholarships, the University has instituted other Endowment Prizes, Gold Medals, Cash Prizes and other Prizes for meritorious students. A few of them are instituted by some eminent law firms, companies and individuals which are given at the time of the Convocation.
