Item No: 1. Introduction of two years (four semesters) LL.M.,(Distance Education) Programme in **Justice Administration and ADR** exclusively for Judicial Officers / Executive of UNION /State / Corporate / Advocate of Seven Years Standing at Bar

Or

Commencement of FOUR YEAR LL.M., integrated (CBCS) for Graduates for specializations mentioned in PART-II (C) of Bar Council of India Rules 2008.

Resolution: After a detailed discussion, in relation to introduction of LL.M. (Distance Education) programme in Justice Administration and ADR, it was resolved that the office of the Registrar shall undertake the ground work in the form of permission needed and a standards to be complied with and place the matter before the Board in the ensuing meeting. It was further resolved that, the proposal of four year LL.M. integrated programme need not be acted upon in the light of above resolution.

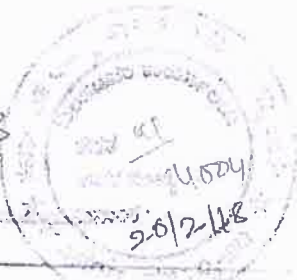
Sir,
