## Proceedings of the B.O.S.(U.G.) meeting held on 11.04.2018 in the Conference Hall of the University

The members of the board deliberated on each item elaborately and resolved on each of them as follows.

**Item No: 1.** To consider the BMS College of Law Letter, regarding splitting of subject: Constitution.

**Resolution:** The board discussed in detail the request of BMS College of Law, Bengaluru regarding the splitting of Constitutional Law subject into courses of 100 marks each. It was unanimously resolved that the request cannot be considered in view of the fact that, all the 28 Law subjects prescribed for study are equally

important and splitting Constitutional Law into two papers, will require one of 27 subjects to be taken out of syllabus. Further, the Constitutional Law syllabus that is in force as on date is framed by experts after wide consultations and was notified with effect from the academic year 2016 – 2017. The house felt that frequent change in syllabus in a University having jurisdiction all over the state, is not advisable.

**Item No: 2.** To consider the BMS College of Law Letter No: BMSCL/996/2017-2018 dated: 09 Feb 2018, regarding Opting of 'Kannada' as optional subject by the students of II semester of 5yrs B.A.,LL.B. & 5yrs B.Com.,LL.B. degree courses for the Academic year 2017-18.

**Resolution:** It was resolved that the request of the college cannot be considered and the college has to follow the syllabus and circulars issued by The Karnataka State Law University from time to time.

**Item No: 3.** To consider the SDM Law College students requisition for change of subject from Kannada to Special English.

**Resolution:** It was resolved that the request of the college cannot be considered and college has to follow the syllabus and circulars issued by the Karnataka State Law University from time to time.

**Item No: 4.** To consider the UGC Letter D.O.F.No.1-11/2016 (CPP-II) dtd: 5<sup>th</sup> October 2017.

**Resolution:** As the concerned letter relates to the expert committee's model syllabus of the subject of psychology at BA/BSc/ MA/M.Sc., Ph.D. Programmes, it was resolved that KSLU need not act upon the letter.

Resolution: The candidates who took admission for the academic years 2009-2010 and 2010-2011 and have not been able to successfully complete their degrees even after the end of 6 years and an extended period of two consecutive attempts have submitted their representations to the office of Hon'ble Governor of Karnataka, the Chief Minister of Karnataka, the Minister for Law and Parliamentary Affairs, Syndicate members and various authorities. All their representations are forwarded to the University for needful action.

After a thorough discussion it is resolved that, the students who took admission for the academic years 2009-2010 and 2010-2011 and have not successfully completed their degrees at the end of 6 years and an extended period of two consecutive attempts shall be given one more attempt as a golden opportunity to complete their degrees. It was further resolved to recommend that, the concerned regulation governing 3 year LL.B. programme may be amended as appended in Annexure I.
