

5. Employer/ Advocates' Feedback on Curriculum & Syllabus Evaluation

Employers are also one of the most important stakeholders and for the purpose of finding out the observation of lawyers/ employers, feedbacks were sent to the advocates, who have appointed the alumni of KSLU. The criteria used are to reflect their observation on their juniors and the quality exhibited by the juniors not only in submissions but also in areas such as knowledge, discipline, etc. The objectives of collecting Employer/Advocates' Feedback are to rate the significance of the curriculum and syllabi, to measure the capacity and knowledge of their juniors after joining the profession, to identify how far the syllabus has been effective enough to make them good professionals, and to receive further comments and suggestions on the programme.

The University received total 22 feedbacks from the Teachers. All the responses on different aspects are presented below.

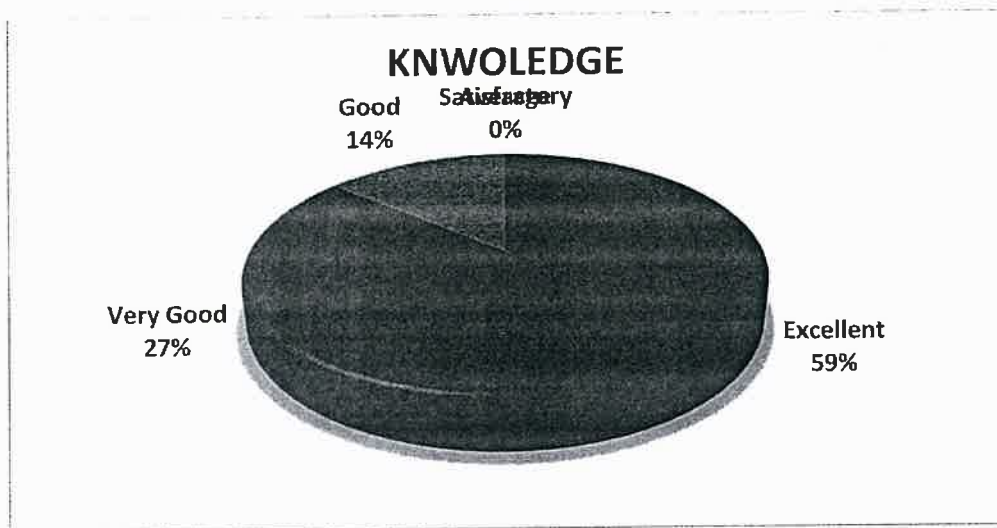

Besides that, for the specific question, "whether the syllabus of the law course meets your Organisations requirements?", all the responding employers answered, "Yes".

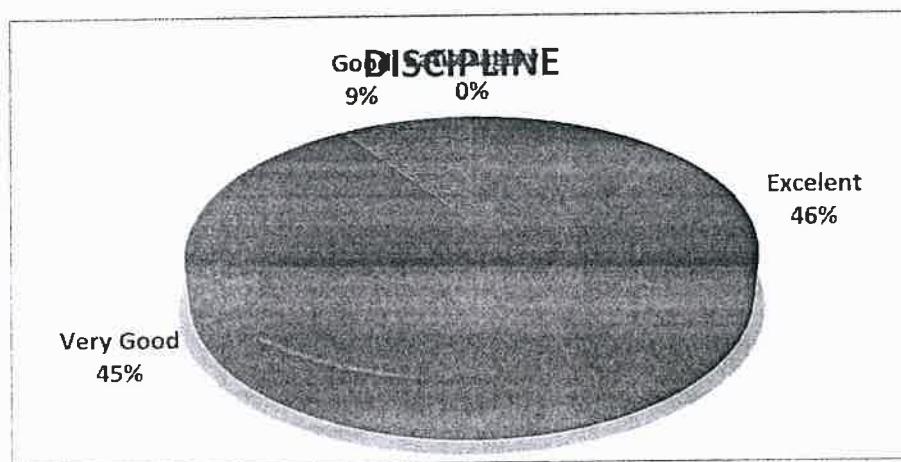
For the question, "Does the syllabus effectively cover topics on fundamentals and latest information on law?", all of them answered as "Yes."

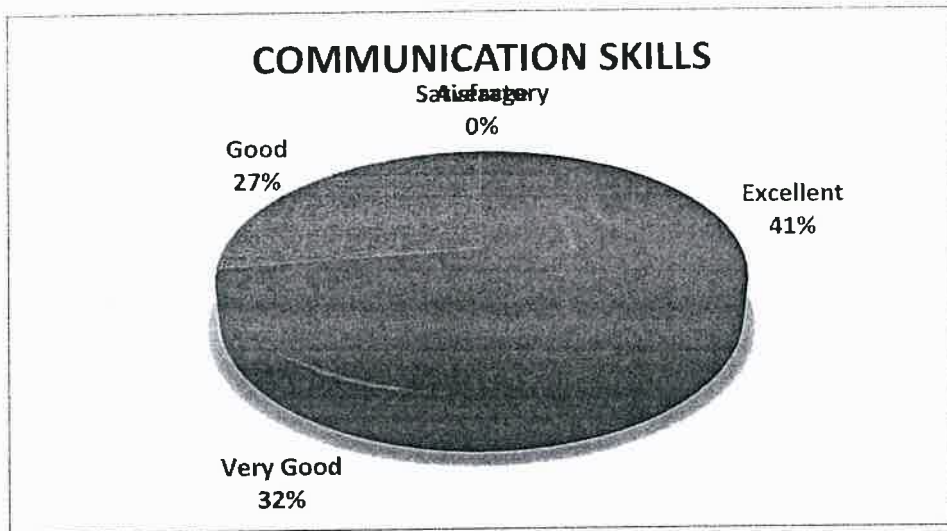
1. Knowledge



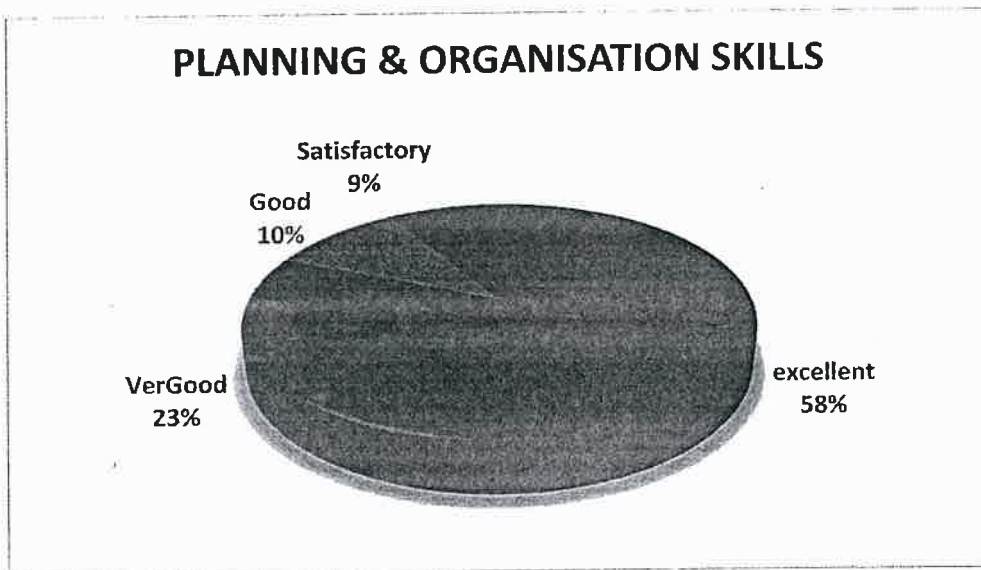
2. Discipline



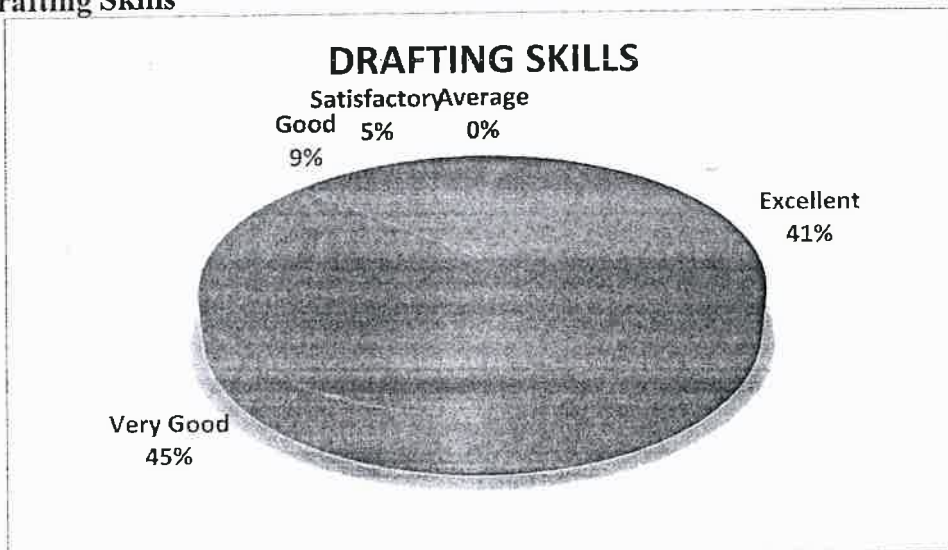
3. Communication Skill



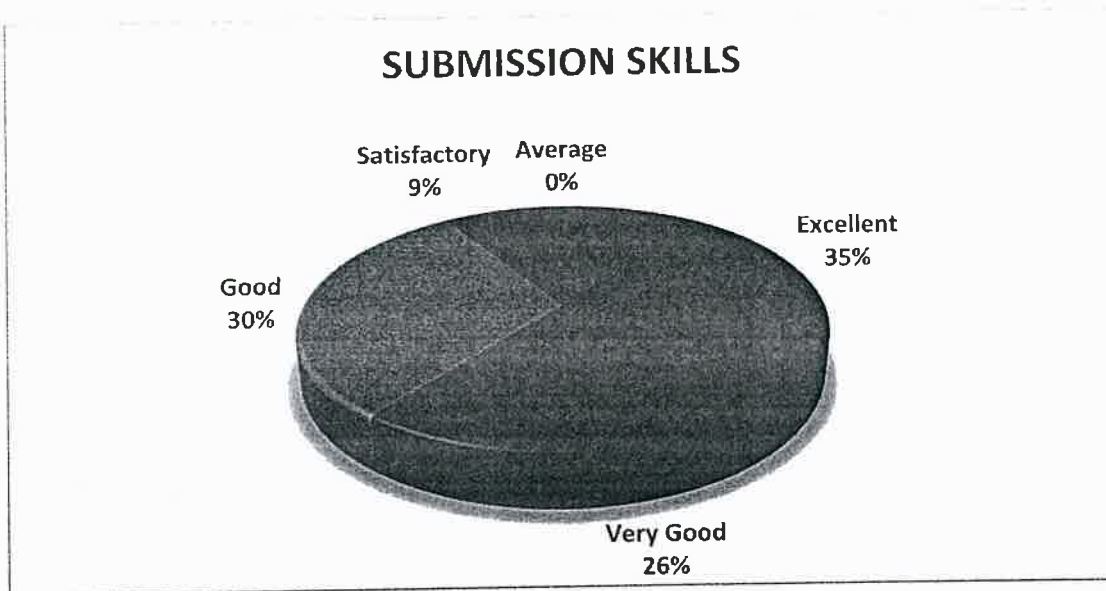
4. Planning and Organisation Skill

Observations:

The following are the observations made from the feedback given-

- All the Employers are satisfied with the existing syllabus.
- The Employers consider the existing syllabus is adequate to and makes the young lawyers ready for entering the profession.
- Majority of the employers opined that the students of Law School, who joined their offices have good knowledge, and Discipline.
- Although the opinion of the employer about the communication skill, oral and written submission skills, and planning & organisation skills of the junior/s is satisfactory, there is a scope for improvement.

Action Taken:

It was resolved that,

1. the Law School has to offer Spoken English Classes as value added course to the needy students.
2. More emphasis on oral and written submission skills should be given, while teaching ADR and DPC and Moot Court Exercises & Internship subjects to improve their Professional Skills.
3. to Make the students to develop planning and Organisation skills, they should be assigned the responsibilities in organizing events in KSLU's Law School.
