

01	THREE YEAR LL.B.DEGREE COURSE IN LAW	Rules 7 (b). Minimum percentage of marks in qualifying examination shall not be below 45% (44.5% and above shall be treated as 45%) of total marks in case of general category applicants and 40% of total marks in case of SC and ST applicants. Explanation : Aggregate of marks in the qualifying examinations means aggregate of marks in the final year of the qualifying examination or aggregate of all the years in the qualifying examination.	Rules 7 (b). Minimum percentage of marks in qualifying examinations shall not be below 45% (44.5% and above shall be treated as 45%) of total marks in case of general category applicants, 42% (41.5% and above shall be treated as 42%) of the total marks in case of OBC category and 40% (39.5% and above shall be treated as 40%) of total marks in case of SC and ST applicants.
