The award of classes shall be as under:

- a) 70% and more: First Class with Distinction
- b) 60% and above but less than 70%: First Class.
- c) 50% and above but less than 60%: Second Class.
- d) 40% and above but less than 50%: Pass Class


16. Award of Grades.

A) Award of grades shall be as under:


- a) CGPA = 5.00 and < 5.50: B
- Pass
- b) CGPA > 5.50 and < 6.00 : B+
- Good
- c) CGPA \geq 6.00 and < 6.50 : A
- Very Good
- d) CGPA \geq 6.50 and < 7.00 : A+
- Excellent
- e) CGPA \geq 7. : O
- Outstanding


B) The marks secured in Add-on Courses and marks awarded by way of internal assessment in any courses shall not be considered to compute SGPA and CGPA as also for the award of Ranks.
