(d)</p> <p>The candidates who have taken admission for the academic years 2009-2010 and 2010-2011 and have not successfully completed their degrees at the end of 6 years and an extended period of two consecutive attempts, shall be provided two more attempt as a last opportunity, to complete their degrees as a one-time measure.</p>	<p>The candidates who took admission for the academic years 2009-2010 and 2010-2011 and have not been able to successfully complete their degrees even after the end of six years and an extended period of two consecutive attempts, have submitted their representations to the office of Hon'ble Governor of Karnataka, the Chief Minister of Karnataka, the Minister for Law and Parliamentary Affairs, Syndicate members and various authorities. All their representations are forwarded to the University for needful action, Given the fact that, in spite of investing 7 years of the precious time many of the students have failed in one or two subjects, and hence have not completed their degrees. As a compassionate measure, the candidates may be given two more attempt, as a one-time benefit and golden opportunity to complete their degrees.</p>
