No student shall be permitted to appear for the end- of-semester examination in a given course unless he/she has, to the satisfaction of the course teacher, fulfilled the course requirements and has put in not less than 75% attendance in the course concerned.  Provided that a student who has attended not less than 70% of classes in each of the subjects prescribed may be permitted to keep the term for reasons to be recorded in writing and to the satisfaction of the Principal of the College or the Dean of the Faculty as the case may be. Provided further that the shortage of attendance of a student due to his/her representing the institution/university in extra curricular activities such as NSS, NCC, Moot Court, Sports and other similar activities recognized by the institution or the University to the extent of number of days his/her participation inclusive of period spent for journey shall be condoned on production of attendance certificate issued by the	end-of-semester examination unless in a given course he/she has fulfilled the course requirements and has kept the term by putting in not less than 75% attendance in the course concerned. A student shall keep the term by filing the examination application form with necessary fees.  Provided that a student who has attended not less than 70% of classes in each of the subjects prescribed may be permitted to keep the term for reasons to be recorded in writing and to the satisfaction of the Principal of the College or the Dean of the Faculty as the case may be. i) A student who has completed all the courses prescribed for the two semesters in an academic year by securing not less than forty percent of the marks in each of the courses shall be eligible to pursue his studies in the next academic year of the programme.

- ii) Provided that the University may
- a) permit a student to pursue the programme in the second academic year even if he has not successfully completed three out of all the courses prescribed for study in the first academic year;
- b) permit a student to pursue the programme in the third year although he has not successfully completed three out of all the courses prescribed for study for the second year provided he has successfully completed all the courses prescribed for the first year of the programme;
- c) permit a student to pursue the programme in the fourth year although he has not successfully completed three out of all the courses prescribed for study for the third year provided he has successfully completed all the courses prescribed for the second year of the programme;

d)permit a student to pursue the programme on the fifth year although he has not successfully completed three out of all the courses prescribed for study for the fourth year provided he has successfully completed all the courses prescribed for the third year of the programme.

- e) A student who does not secure a minimum of 40% in any course shall be declared as failed.

To bring the regulations in conformity with the UGC gaidelines as directed vide letter No. D.O.No.F.12-1/2015(CPP-

- to repeat the following end of semester examination provided he or she makes an application to the Principal of the college within the date prescribed by the University by paying required fees.
- iii) The University shall permit a student to improve his score in any semester when he has secured a minimum of 40% marks in each of the course.
- iv) Notwithstanding the foregoing, the University may permit a student who has carried forward not more than three courses from any or all of the previous semesters to continue in the programme provided he successfully completes those courses by the time the final results of the Five Year B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) programme are announced.
- v) Students who has filled the exam form by paying prescribed fee but remained absent in the exam shall only be permitted to appear in those subjects along with subsequent semester examination.

- 40% in any course shall be declared as failed.
- f) Students who have failed in a course may be permitted to repeat the following end of semester examination provided he or she makes an application to the Principal of the college within the date prescribed by the University by paying required fees.
- iii) The University shall permit a student to improve his score in any semester when he has secured a minimum of 40% marks in each of the course.
- iv) Notwithstanding the foregoing, the University may permit a student who has carried forward not more than three courses from any or all of the previous semesters to continue in the programme provided he successfully completes those courses by the time the final results of the Five Year B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) programme are announced.
- v) Students who have filled the exam form by paying prescribed fee but remained absent in the exam shall only be permitted to appear in those subjects along with subsequent semester examination.
- vi) (a) Students are required to successfully complete the entire course within Seven years (Five years of normal duration plus two years of extended duration) from admission to the course.
- vi) (b) The candidates who do not complete their degree within Seven years shall be given an extended period of one more year in exceptional circumstances mentioned herein after. When the candidate is unable to appear for the examinations during the extended period of two years-
- i. Due to health reasons to be certified by a qualified medical practitioner.
- ii. Due to supervening disability to be certified by a qualified medical practitioner.
- Due to representing the Country/ State/ University in any sports or co-curricular competitions.

Provided the candidate has reported the inability to appear for the examination to the Registrar through the Principal / Director of the respective college within one month of the date of examination which he/she is unable to attend or the term he /she is unable to keep.

Provided further that the candidate who has represented the Country/State/University in any sports or co-curricular competitions should have participated in such events with the prior permission of the University obtained by applying through the Principal / Director of the College.

(c). A student who shas kept the term of any semester shall be allowed to go to the next semester.	
(d). A student who fails to keep the term in even semester of any year shall keep the term of the even semester along with the students of subsequent batches.	
(e). A student who fails to keep the term in odd semester of any year shall take the meadmission to the same year along with the students of subsequent batches.
